

NZMAA CONTEST RULES

Section 7A: Radio Control Scale : Flying Rules,2004

1.a. **INTENT**

The intent of this competition is to foster interest in *SCALE MODEL AIRCRAFT*, by encouraging realistic, prototypical flight plans, and accurate Scale Model Aircraft.

1.a.1 The following classes are considered:

i. **F4C** is the premier international class for flying models of full size aircraft capable of carrying a living pilot. The contestant must be the builder and pilot of the model. All FAI class F4C rules apply

ii **SPORTSMAN R/C SCALE** is for entrants who have not participated in recent competitions and / or people who wish to compete in a simpler form of event without the need to have their model judged statically.

a. The model must be a recognisable Scale Model, either from a kit, plan or ARF

b. A scale paint scheme will be required.

c. "Unless proof of scale and the colour scheme is provided by the contestant the contest director may determine if the model is a replica of a full size aircraft and has the replica's colour scheme."

d. No "Builder of the Model" Rule

e. The FAI F4C flying Schedule will be used.

iii. **TEAM SPORTSMAN RADIO CONTROL SCALE** is for entrants who have not participated in recent competitions and/or people who wish to compete in a simpler form of event without the need to have their model judged statically and do not wish to fly their model in the sportsman event.

a. The model must be a recognisable Scale Model, either from a kit, plan or ARF

b. A scale paint scheme will be required.

c. "Unless proof of scale and the colour scheme is provided by the contestant the contest director may determine if the model is a replica of a full size aircraft and has the replica's colour scheme."

d. No "Builder of the Model" Rule

e. The FAI F4C flying Schedule will be used.

f. The Builder of the model and the Pilot will receive recognition for their place in the event as a team.

1.a.2. Any Model may be entered in one class at any competition.

1.a.3. Each Contestant may compete only with one model in any one class.

1.a.4. A Contestant may have one assistant during an official flight, but if the model is of a multi-engined prototype, the contestant may have two helpers. No helpers may touch the transmitter during an official flight.

1.b.1 Models must comply with NZMAA standards of maximum weight, wing loading and engine capacity.

- 1.b.2. All models of a size to be required by the NZMAA to have a Large Model Certificate must have the Certificate available for inspection by the C.D.
